Plant-for-the-Planet is a children's and youth initiative that educates children in how to get active against the climate crisis and plants trees. 55,000 Climate Justice Ambassadors from 53 countries already attended the Plant-for-the-Planet Academies. The children and youth aim to plant 1,000 billion trees. They are responsible for the official tree counter, handed over

to them in 2011 by the United Nations Environmental Program. Plant-for-the-Planet was initiated by the nine year old Felix Finkbeiner from Germany. Within the following ten years, the children and youth have planted more than 14 billion trees with the help of many adults and organizations.
